

# PILBARA COLLABORATION CHARTER

## Purpose

A commitment between Pilbara resources companies and the Western Australian government to work in collaboration to address specific and interrelated priorities.

## Assumptions

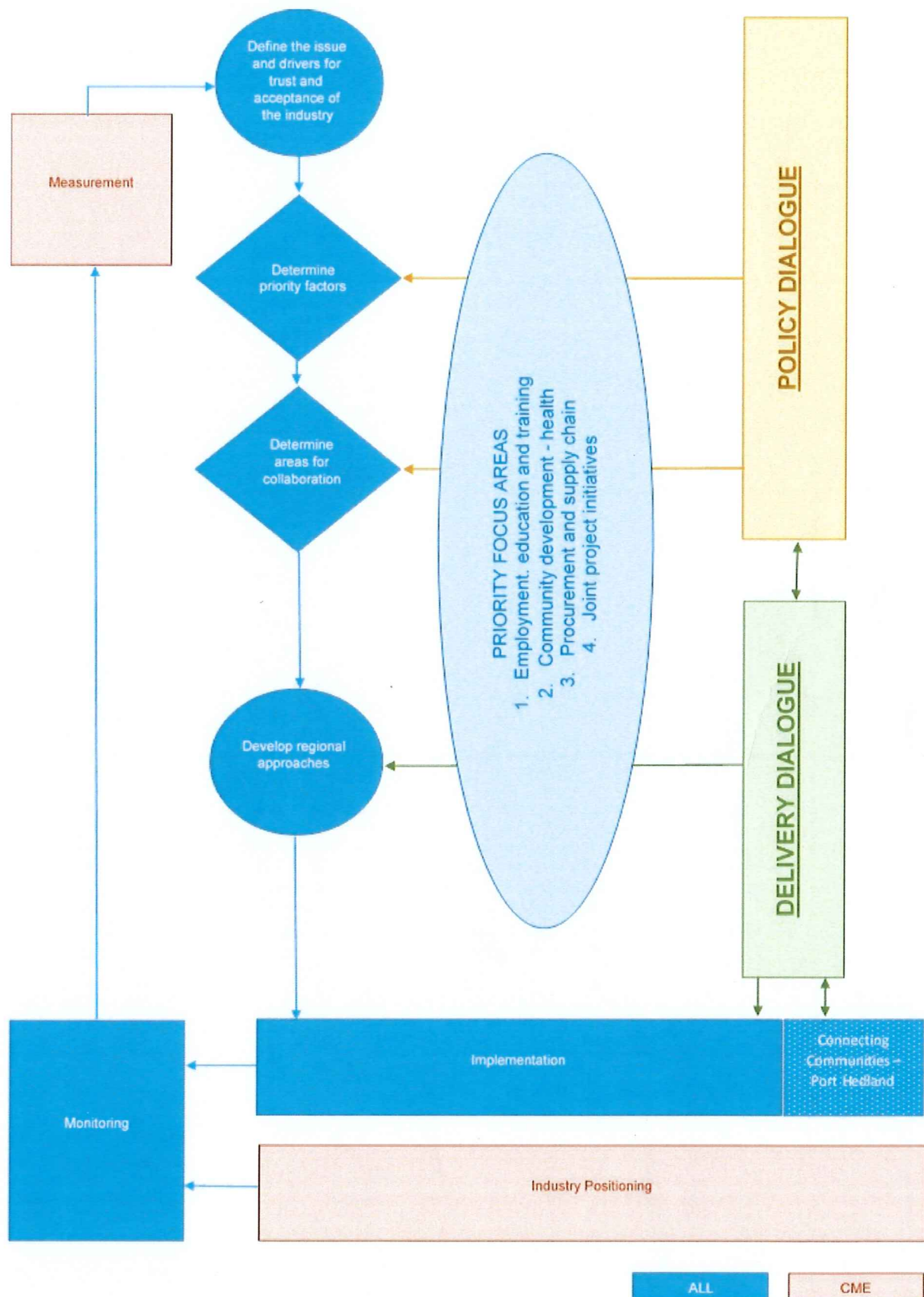
- Government and industry are prepared to take a strategic approach, targeting areas for action and trial new and innovative approaches to achieve outcomes and efficient and effective use of resources given limited finances.
- Communication and coordination between government, industry and community is imperative in progressing the agenda.
- The Pilbara Collaboration will target issues which can only be addressed through cross-sector collaboration.
- A structured approach to bringing people together will result in a greater collective impact.
- Companies have specific individual target communities they will prioritise.
- There are differing level of awareness and understanding of the existing social and economic contribution of the sector.

## Intent

1. Enable efficient collaboration between Pilbara resources companies and the Western Australian Governments.
2. Ensure efforts deliver sustainable improved social and economic impact to host communities through intentional planning, identification of common goals and coordinated action towards those goals over a longer term horizon.
3. Develop improved understanding and dialogue between government and industry.
4. Engagement will occur with the Federal government and relevant local governments.










